Walk on Wednesday **17th** December 2025

Venue: Horsell Common

Distance: About 4 - 4.5 miles

Meeting: 10am . Wetlands Car Park beside Heather Farm Café, GU21 4XY .Chobham Road (A3046). From Six Crossroads, take the Shores Road (A245) exit to the roundabout at the end. Turn Right onto A3046 to the next roundabout. Stay on the A3046 towards Chobham (2nd exit) and shortly after this, turn right into the Wetlands Centre, signposted Wetlands or Heather Farm Café maybe? and another indicating Heather Farm. Hopefully the road works at the end of Shores Road will be finished by then. **This car park does get quite full, so please allow time for parking.**

The Walk: This is our annual pre-Christmas walk on Horsell Common. Once again we hope to stop for elevenses at Fair Oaks Airfield. The route may well be muddy depending on rainfall nearer the time (when we checked the walk out it was really quite dry, but.....??)

PLEASE WEAR SUITABLE FOOTWEAR. The walk is flat with no stiles.

Lunch: No special arrangements have been made for lunch as the pubs are usually dealing with Christmas lunches. The Plough in South Road might be a possibility, or the Heather Farm Café, which is now run by Barons, The Cricketers, Horsell Birch, or The Hangar Café at Fair Oaks.
